Mission, Capabilities & Program Priorities

Institutional mission

HRVG advances human dignity, equitable opportunity, protection, education, community wellbeing, and inclusive development through cross-sector partnerships, research-informed programming, advocacy, capacity strengthening, and responsible resource mobilization.

Core capabilities

- **Partnership architecture**
Convening, relationship development, institutional alignment, concept development, collaboration instruments, and joint planning.
- **Program and proposal development**
Needs framing, technical concepts, grant narratives, budgets, results frameworks, workplans, risk planning, and sustainability pathways.
- **Institutional capacity strengthening**
Governance, safeguarding, operations, communications, workforce coordination, reporting, and organizational readiness.
- **Evidence and learning**
Research, baseline development, monitoring, community feedback, learning products, and transparent results reporting.

Priority program areas

- **Education and opportunity**
Inclusive education, girls and youth development, educator support, multidisciplinary learning, professional skills, and institutional partnerships.
- **Rights, protection, and wellbeing**
Human-rights education, safeguarding, prevention, referral pathways, psychosocial wellbeing, and coordinated community support.
- **Inclusive institutions and communities**
Public-sector collaboration, civic inclusion, community capacity, women and youth leadership, and locally driven development.

Each funding opportunity will be supported by a tailored proposal defining the need, participants, location, partners, activities, results, budget, safeguards, risks, and reporting commitments.



Funding Pathways & Use of Resources

Ways to fund HRVG

- **General operating support**
Leadership, workforce, governance, finance, compliance, technology, communications, safeguarding, monitoring, and institutional resilience.
- **Program-restricted grants**
Defined interventions with an approved proposal, geography, participant group, partner roles, activities, budget, results, and reporting schedule.
- **Planning and design grants**
Needs assessment, co-design, feasibility, technical validation, baseline research, partnership formation, and investment-ready proposal development.
- **Multi-year strategic partnerships**
Longer-term support combining institutional strengthening, program delivery, learning, adaptation, and responsible expansion.
- **In-kind and technical contributions**
Expertise, technology, training, research, equipment, facilities, communications, logistics, and professional services.

Resource-allocation principles

- **Mission alignment**
Resources are directed toward agreed public-benefit objectives and approved organizational or program priorities.
- **Budget discipline**
Every award should have a reviewed budget, authorization structure, documentation standards, restricted-fund controls, and variance management.
- **Value and sustainability**
Investment decisions should consider participant benefit, local ownership, partner contribution, cost effectiveness, institutional strengthening, and continuity beyond the grant.

Funding amounts are determined by the scope, duration, geography, partner structure, delivery requirements, evidence plan, and approved proposal-specific budget.



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Accountability, Due Diligence & Next Steps

Accountability commitments

- **Governance and authority**
Material commitments, agreements, budgets, representations, and reports are subject to appropriate institutional approval and document control.
- **Financial stewardship**
HRVG supports documented budgets, procurement, authorization thresholds, separation of duties, restricted-fund tracking, reconciliations, and professional review.
- **Safeguarding and ethics**
Funded activities should protect children, adults at risk, communities, personnel, and partners through safe design, conduct standards, reporting pathways, and appropriate response.
- **Measurement and transparency**
Results should be supported by agreed indicators, responsible data practices, evidence schedules, learning, financial reporting, and explanations of limitations or variance.

Documentation available during due diligence

Upon an appropriate request, HRVG can provide applicable organizational, governance, staffing, financial, partnership, safeguarding, program, budget, monitoring, and compliance documentation. Confidential or restricted records may require verification of the requesting institution and a confidentiality agreement.

Schedule an executive funding conversation to confirm alignment, select the most suitable funding pathway, and authorize preparation of a tailored concept note or proposal, detailed budget, results framework, implementation plan, and due-diligence package.
